What kind of place is Kuni Palace?

The setting for "that thing" familiar from textbooks

In the 12th year of Tenpyo (740), Emperor Shomu decided to move the capital from Heijō-kyō to Kuni-kyō, meaning that Japan's capital was established here during the Nara period!

Little over three years, it was an important stage in history, with famous laws such as the "Imperial Rescript on the Construction of Provincial Temples" and the "Konden Einen Shizai Law" being enacted, some of which are still in textbooks today. Currently, a large area of the Kuni Palace ruins is a national
